Associated with the Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court is a Court Service Unit (CSU), sometimes called the Juvenile Probation department. The CSU serves the court and facilitates the supervision, rehabilitation and treatment as needed by those who come before the court.

An essential function of the court service unit is *Intake* which involves the filing of petitions for Custody, Visitation, Support, Protective Orders and Emancipation. Intake also involves the processing of complaints of delinquent behavior or truancy and runaway behavior; staff then determine whether matters are handled formally by the Court or informally by the CSU. Intake complaints can be made by a parent or guardian of a juvenile seeking resources for a child demonstrating delinquent behavior.

Other functions include *Court Investigations* and *Probation and Parole Supervision* for individuals up to age 21.
