

Marijuana is STILL ILLEGAL in Virginia

DID YOU KNOW?

Possessing marijuana or giving or selling marijuana could land you in jail and/or with a fine up to \$2,500.

EDUCATE YOURSELF. IS IT WORTH IT?





DID YOU KNOW?

- Possessing marijuana can land you in jail for up to 30 days with a fine up to \$500.
- If convicted twice for possessing marijuana, you could land in jail for up to 1 year and/or fined up to \$2,500.
- Giving or selling less than 1/2 ounce of marijuana can land you in jail for up to 1 year and a fine up to \$2,500.
- Giving or selling more than 1/2 ounce but less than 5 lbs of marijuana is a felony and can land you in jail for 1 to 10 years. By discretion of a jury or a judge, jail time can be less than one year.
- Giving or selling more than 5 lbs of marijuana is a felony and can result in imprisonment for 5 to 30 years.
- As an owner, landlord, manager, chief executive officer, operator or tenant of any office, store, shop, restaurant, dance hall, theater, poolroom, clubhouse, storehouse, warehouse, dwelling, house, apartment, building of any kind, vehicle, vessel, boat or aircraft who knowingly allows, keeps, or maintains a person under the influence of marijuana can be punished by up to 1 year in jail and/or fined up to \$2,500.
- Any unlawful user of marijuana will be disqualified from obtaining a concealed handgun permit.
